42 powder into Mr Hollingsworth's hands and
requested him to forward it to you - The
Bill of Lading is for the Delivery of the Goods
on Payment of \$6. 5. - in Dollars at 4/6. but
the Owner of the vessel alleges an agreement
with Mr Harrison that the Customary Freight
should be paid nothing of the kind is
mentioned in Mr Harrison's letter to Mr
& Harrison will you be pleased to write me -
whether Mr Harrison has advised you of it and
what you would have done - The claim is
10 p^{cts} on the Powder valued at 5 p^{cts} which
comes to just double the money mentioned in
the Bill of Lading.
