The Indian purchases have had two meetings nothing concluded is word. - All parties are willing to incorporate but the defect in the Deed of the Indian purchase has created some difficulty which has suspended our Deliberations until the opinion of the owners can be known one and joint. It is said by some of the purchasers of the Indian, that they will advance three thousand pounds sterling and no more, to verify the Deed, and if that should not be sufficient, the sum that shall be requisite shall hereafter be advanced by the incorporated Company. The purchasers of the land that are incorporated, are willing (if the latter should not prove sufficient to verify the Deed) to leave the same upon which it shall be verified to further discussion - Your opinion and that of the Gentlemen in Council for whom I act must be conveyed in order to some one of their Attorneys before any thing can be done.
