All the search that could be made by the Police was made for Dr P. We began to work on January 24<sup>th</sup>. About that hour Blake called me to his office where I found 8 or 9 other gentlemen. They asked me what I could do. I said I could send to the West End. They insisted on it. I sent for two West End officers & told them Dr P. was missing. I told them to go to Dr's houses & look & enquire for the Dr. at 2<sup>nd</sup> St. One of the officers reported that all he could hear of him was that he was seen the day before. At 2<sup>nd</sup> St. then I Blake requested me to notify all the Police & I did inform the whole. & they reported at 6 o'clock. I advised all in the evening papers. & notice was given in them accordingly. And Dr P was missing.

It was impossible to make any more general or thorough search than was made. I then the form of the city of York - the published & distributed 28 to 28,000 handbills
