But should the Gov^t here attempt to go
further & endeavor to create a probability
that these remains are parts of the body of Dr P,
not only because they were found near to
the place where they alledge he was last
seen or known to be alive, but because also
they were found in the possession of Dr W
or in the premises of which he had the
exclusive control, saying that this consideration
belongs to this branch of enquiry, but belongs
wholly to the question of the direct agency - the
imputed guilt of Dr W. & is properly to be
considered under that head only.

Now upon these circumstances & the attached
proof of the identity of the remains, & 2^{ds}
the probability that they are parts of his
body, because found near where he was
last seen or known to be alive - is it left
to open speculating that he is dead -
