same principle which requires that upon a charge
of homicide, ~~even when the body has been~~

still be fully & satisfactorily proved that
the cause of the death was either occasioned
by natural causes, by accident, or by the
act of the party himself.

The popular notion that he who
killed - ought not to be answerable
for the death - Even one should be
proven it.

hanging by which this uncertainty is
sought to be removed.
