

3. The absence of all proof of hostile - certainly of strong hostile feelings on the part of Dr W - & the fact of my being like a strut - or 2 a choice to unwarily in any way -

4. The idea that the homicide involves the idea of a premeditated & deliberate plan of murder - which is 1<sup>st</sup> inadmissible except upon the best understanding proof - & 2<sup>nd</sup> that the Govt have failed, as has been shown to prove that Dr W. accused Dr W to the College of false statements.

Now will the Subsequent attempt to conceal the body or the unhappy treatment of it from the death was occasioned by Malice or jealousy - for we can tell how another would conduct under circumstances of such a homicide in such situation.

Great error doubtless, but inadvisable to have avowed the act - but desire to avoid consequences & temptation of jealousy opportunity of concealment led to the first error - after which with the best isolate to make the avowal & explanation - which led to all Subsequent consequences.

And this hypothesis of jealousy is quite sufficient
