Some time ago it was decided by the Municipal Hospital that it was necessary to build a stable and a laundry. We realized that until the laundry is constructed it will be impossible to get heat for the hospital, for the reason that the heating plant is to be established in the laundry.

I have been informed that the Board of Awards rejected all bids for the construction of the laundry and stable recently. I have been informed that the Atlas Construction Company, who are building the hospital, state that they are willing to construct the two buildings for the sum named in their bid submitted to the Board of Awards some time ago, or possibly at a lower price.

As you probably know, the Board of Estimates this year appropriated a sufficient sum to erect these buildings and to equip the hospital, the money to be available in 1908.

I am now writing to ask you how to proceed in the matter. Will it be necessary to advertise for new bids for the construction of the laundry and stable, or will it be possible for the work to be done by the Atlas Construction Company under their former bid?
