I hand you herewith tally sheet and bills which have been presented us by the Reistertown Turnpike Company for the use of their road. I also attach copy of a letter from Asst. City Engineer Compton to Mr. Thos. A. Murray, the Secretary of the company. It does seem to me that these bills are entirely unjust, and I cannot see by what right the Turnpike people fix, as they have done, Franklin Street and Penna. Avenue as the limit of their gate. The Reistertown Turnpike Company has nothing to do with Penna. Avenue, under the decisions of the Legal Department, south of North Avenue. North of North Avenue, they may have some control.

They charge us 15¢ a round trip from Penna. & Pulton Avenues to Park Heights Avenue and the Park Gate, which is a distance of a little more than a mile.

I shall be obliged if you will look into this matter and advise me as to whether or not I shall pay these bills.
