a Code, I am not prepared to say in this case that Section 45 of Article 48, of the City Code of 1893, is not still in force.

It is true that it is provided by Ordinance No. 165, February 24, 1899, Section 5, that in all paving or repaving of streets, unless it shall be otherwise provided by City Ordinance, directing such paving or repaving, the work shall be done by contract, or else by labor employed by the City, and paid by the City, as in the judgment of the Mayor and the City Engineer may be best for the interests of the City, but it may well be questioned whether the terms "by contract" are not broad enough to cover the paving arrangement between the City and property owners, outlined by Sections 45, 46 and 47 of Article 48.
