charges are preferred and sustained could be removed by ordinance.

As Mr. Mason seems to be so naturally and deeply concerned about the case, perhaps he would be willing to institute the necessary prosecution himself, though by making this statement, I do not mean to imply that the City government may not itself have a duty to perform in the premises. As it is, if I had been asked the question, which I was not, I would have been compelled to say that for all that is shown by the letter from Mr. Mason, Love never so far as I know having been removed was not disqualified by the two offenses imputed to him by Mr. Mason, from continuing to act as a constable.
