The City Engineer communicated with this Department in reference thereto, and I advised him, that if he was proceeding in accordance with the Ordinance of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, he need not desist therefrom, because of anything stated in the letter of Mr. Baldwin.

Under the Police power, the City has the right to order a nuisance to be removed from private property, and the grading, curbing and paving in this case is being done by the City Engineer by order of the Commissioner of Health, in order to abate a nuisance.
