In reply to your letter of the 2nd inst., in reference to printing the Book of Appropriations for 1912, I beg to advise you that it is not necessary that this Book should be printed by the City Printers, Messrs. Meyer & Thalheimer.

The public printer is appointed by both Branches of the City Council, by virtue of Section 208 of the City Code (1906) to execute the printing required by both Branches of the City Council. This employment evidently refers to the printing of the proceedings, etc., of the City Council, and does not include the City printing, as a whole, or printing of any particular board of department of the City government.

I beg to advise you, therefore, that the Board of Estimates may give this contract to the lowest bidder.
