With reference to the two bills of the Maryland School for Boys, one for \$216.22 covering the charge of boys committed to the institution from that section of Anne Arundel County annexed to Baltimore City by Chapter 82 of the Acts of 1918, and one for \$1155.60 covering boys committed from the section of Baltimore County annexed by the Acts of 1918.

By Chapter 300 of the Acts of 1918, the Maryland School for Boys was made a State institution, and by Section 6 of that Act, it was provided that the Board of Managers of the Training School should provide accommodation and care for at least two hundred and fifty inmates committed to said school from the various counties of the State and from Baltimore City, to be apportioned among the several counties and the City, according to the population as ascertained by the preceding census.
