and guide you in the administration thereof. The law has clothed you with the power of decision in the first instance on the facts, subject to review before the Board of Zoning Appeals.

I think I have covered the subject sufficiently for you to adopt a safe course of conduct, and I am subject to your further inquiries in the interpretation of the law or to guide you in its administration.

I return Mr. Krieger's letter herewith.

Dear Sir:

When you were in this office yesterday you left with me an executed copy of a contract between the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore and the Tabulating Machine Company, dated January 20, 1925.
