You handed me recently a letter from Judge Lee I. Hecht, President of the Appeal Tax Court, in which he requested your opinion as to the right of Mr. T. M. Maynadier to relief from the payment of paving tax assessed against his property located on the east side of Park Avenue between Whitelock Street and Mount Royal Avenue.

This tax, as you know, is called the "special paving tax", and has its origin in the provisions of Chapter 688 of the Acts of 1912 and is a part of the Baltimore City Charter of 1912 in Section 841-ff and succeeding sections.
