Dear Mr. Evans:

You have referred to me the letter of July 11, 1940, from Hollis J. Howe, City Forester, to yourself, in regard to a tree in the footway of No. 18 Hamilton Street. To Mr. Howe's letter were attached three photographs of this tree. These photographs indicate that the tree in question projects over the bed of the street itself, that it leans to the eastward at approximately a thirty degree angle, and that approximately one-fourth of the tree, about a foot from the base, has been eaten out by insects or has disintegrated by reason of decay.
