Dear Judge Reamer:

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of June 29, 1940, requesting my views as to the laws and ordinances relating to the erection of signs insofar as they are applicable to a certain oil-cloth sign located by Mr. Cohen on the premises known as 717 W. Baltimore Street.

Article 3, Section 5, Paragraph 16 of the Baltimore City Code (1927 Edition) provides, in part, as follows:

"No shed, platform, sign, temporary structure or detached structure or object of any kind shall be erected on any such public property (avenue, street, alley or other public property) without a separate street permit signed by the Buildings Engineer."

Article 3, Section 5, Paragraph 17 of the Baltimore City Code (1927 Edition) provides:

"No such vault, extension or street permit shall be given unless the right to so use the avenue, street,
