Dear Mr. Evans:

You have referred to me the letter of January 10, 1941, from the Board of School Commissioners to yourself in regard to whether or not a boy should be enrolled in the Forest Park High School before his parents pay the non-resident tuition fees which accrued prior to his application for enrollment.

The Board of School Commissioners states the facts as follows:

A pupil of the Forest Park High School, whose parents had formerly lived in Baltimore City, became a non-resident in March, 1939, because his parents moved to Randallstown, Baltimore County. The boy, however, did not inform the school that
