Dear Mr. Hergenroeder:

Under date of June 11, 1959, you sent to this office for review proposed Ordinance No. 7 which, if ordained, would prohibit the City Council from passing any ordinance which would change the zoning classifications or use of any property or permit parking areas for automobiles under Section 17 of the zoning law during the period of time extending from the date of a regular municipal primary election, in the year 1963 and in every fourth year thereafter, to the Thursday next after the third Monday in the same year, both dates inclusive.

It will be noted that the period of time involved is set forth as being "from the day of a regular municipal primary election, * * * to the Thursday after the third Monday in the same year." It is obvious that the words "in the month of May" have been inadvertently omitted from the latter part of the above phrase.
