Dear Mr. Porter:

For sometime your office, the City Auditor and this office have had under study the question of whether there was a violation of Ordinance No. 1960, approved May 14, 1959, by the San-Joe Construction Co., Inc.

As you know, Section 14(d) of Ordinance No. 1960 requires that all contractors doing work for the City shall pay at least the minimum hourly wage rates fixed by the schedule of such wage rates forming a part of the contract with the City. A number of cases of alleged violations of this ordinance by San-Joe, in connection with two contracts which the Company has with the City, were called to your attention. The matter was referred to the City Auditor for investigation by him, since the matter could only be resolved by an examination of the books of the Company.

The City Auditor made a very thorough audit of San-Joe's books with respect to the two contracts, one of which
