I give unto my beloved son William Knock all that Tract or parcel of Land ^{called} Hampshire containing Ninety Acres, to him & his ^{Male} Heirs for forever, and if my son William should die without ^{Male} Issue to my son Henry Knock, and if my son Henry should die without Male Issue, to my son George Knock, and if my son George Knock should die without Male Issue, to my son John Knock and his Heirs forever, I also give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Knock a tract or parcel of Land formerly called Bennetts hope, but now called Rachels farm containing forty five acres to him and his Male Heirs forever, and if my son Samuel should die without Male Issue to my son Benjamin Knock, and if my son Benjamin should die without Male Issue to my son William Knock to him & his Heirs forever. I also give unto my sons Daniel, Henry, George, John and Benjamin Knock the sum of one shilling Sterling to be paid to each of them, I also give to my Daughters Lerminta, Genoby, Annal and Rebecca Knock the sum of one shilling Sterling to be paid to each of them by my Executors, I also constitute and appoint my beloved wife Isabella and my son William Knock as my Executors And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul all & every other former Testaments, Wills, Legacies Requests and Executors by me in any way before named, Willed and Bequeathed.
