 in my hands of which she has an Account, Item I hereby
 revoke all former Wills by me made and do declare this
 my only to be my last Will In Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and Seal the twenty fourth day of February in the
 year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy eight.
