Throughout this day strong breeze and squally with rain employed on ship duty the watch on lookout saw steam bound westerly wind from S.W.

Throughout this day calm and squally with rain employed on ship duty watch on lookout saw three steam bound to W. pump Carefull attended Lat- $33^{\circ}14'N$

Thursday the 3rd 1915-

Throughout this day beginning with light breeze at p.m. strong breeze and squally with rain wind from easterly employed on ship duty watch on lookout nothing saw shot down on trysail

no obs. end of this day

June

Friday the 4th 1915-

Throughout this day beginning with strong breeze and high sea and cloudy weather and at p.m. the wind moderate some wind from S.E. employed on ship duty watch on lookout saw steam bound to westerly shot down trysail Lat- $32^{\circ}45'N$

Long $49^{\circ}17'W$

June Saturday 5th 1915-

Throughout this beginning with light breeze and clear weather at p.m. calm employed on ship duty watch on lookout Manuel also saw large white water was to calm we cant make out ship lay on trysail no obs. end day

June

Sunday the 6th 1915-

Throughout this day fresh breeze and cloudy weather wind from S.E. employed on ship duty watch on lookout at 9 10 a.m. Mate saw larger white water long ways of we cant make out saw steam bound westerly pump Carefull attended no obs end of day

Monday

June the 7th 1915-

Throughout this day fresh breeze and clear weather wind from S.E. at 5-20 a.m. Manuel also saw school whales drop three boat third Mate strack one come at 12 30 a.m. cutting and send down the cutting gears down the watch clear up the deck lat- $34^{\circ}09'N$

Long $49^{\circ}21'W$ end of day

June the 8th 1915-

Fresh breeze and clear weather wind from S.E. watch employed on ship duty hauled out and stowed down oil Sydney Victor back to is duty he fill with ship lay on trysail lat- $34^{\circ}04'N$ long $49^{\circ}37'W$
