p.m. light breeze clear weather wind
from north all sail set watch

breeze from S.E. at p.m. light breeze from
N.W. and clear weather all sail set
Close hauled watch employed on ship duty.
Last night at 8:55 Doming Lopes and
Fredrick Coanter have fight this been third
time Fredrick been fight all this west
india crew looking for fight must every day
this John A. Heileger is the head lead of
all he said to Captain that he do not afraid
of no one so he is all ready for fight
at any time lat 32°40' N.
