Tuesday the 24 1915

Throughout this day calm all day at 5 a.m.  
Captain saw School of whales drop  
the boat Chasten all day never get  
any mate struck one mother whales  
by the line of lost it lat 37° 53' N.  
Long. 69° 49' W.  
end of this day

Wednesday the 25 1915

Throughout this day fresh breeze and  
hazy weather wind from westerly watch  
employed on ship duty saw  
nothing but steam bound Easterly  
lat 38° 36' N.  
Long. 69° 50' W. end of this  
day

hazy weather wind from N.E. all the low sail  
Set watch employed on ship duty at 5 o'clock  
L.B. V. saw school whales low  
down the boat mate get one third mate  
get one lat 39° 23' N.  
Long. 71° 08' W. end of this day

Saturday the 28 1915

Throughout this day strong breeze and  
Cloudy weather wind from N.E.  
Watch employed on ship duty cutting  
Whales and ~~fast~~ <sup>try</sup> out saw  
abarek bound to west no obs.  
end of this day

August

Sunday the 29 1915

Throughout this day beginning with  
strong breeze and squalls with rain  
Watch employed on ship duty finish tryout  
and stowed down 18 bb and 26 gal.  
no obs. end of saw several steam going  
by end of this day
