Sunday January 20 1867

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant weather & we
 Sub 2 sails gave the hunter to the balena of 30 f. water
 & we commenced the balena &c
 Middle part pleasant with a light breeze &c
 Latter part the same & we had all sail set to
 the Hunter to balena in sight &c

Monday Jan 21

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & it
 & P.M. we commenced the hunter & it 7 P.M.
 we commenced sail &c
 Middle part pleasant with a light breeze &c
 Latter part the same & we had all sail set
 to the balena & the ship hunter was in sight &c

Tuesday January 22

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we had
 all sail set &c Middle part pleasant with a light breeze
 Latter part pleasant with a pleasant breeze & we had
 all sail set to the Hunter to the S. with a fair wind

Wednesday Jan 23

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant with
 a fresh breeze from the N. & we had all sail set
 to the Hunter to the S. &c
 Middle part strong winds & we were under short
 Latter part blowing a gale & we were lying to under
 a close reef main topsail &c

Thursday January 24

The first part of these 24 hours the weather moderated
 down & left a heavy sea on & we were under short
 sail & then we had some fog & rain &c
 Middle part it cleared off & was a heavy sea on &c
 Latter part good weather & we made sail &c

Friday January 25

The first part of these 24 hours good weather & we sail
 in sight & at 4 P.M. I went on deck & found the Steward
 sick & up in the cabin &c

Middle part Squally & about 7 P.M. we commenced
 the Robert Morris &c
 Latter part strong winds & the Robert Morris in
 sight off our weather quarter & we were under short
 sail &c

Saturday Jan 26 1867

The first part of these 24 hours strong winds & at
 2 P.M. we commenced the hunter & it 7 P.M.
 & at 7 P.M. we commenced the hunter & it 7 P.M.
 Latter part strong winds & some squally & at
 6 A.M. we left our ship off before the hunter again &
 at 11 A.M. we raised 13 right whales & it was blowing
 strong & the whales were killed & we were under short
 sail & we had to make sail & then we got to windward of
 them & we had to bear then we lost the run of them
 & could not see them again & we saw another and going
 quick to the windward. This is all days work

Sunday January 27

The first part of these 24 hours strong winds & squally
 & we had out double reef topsails & carried 12 f. & 12 f. & 12 f.
 & at 4 P.M. the weather moderated down & became a nasty
 sea on & we have been whaling all day & never lowered our boats
 till dark & then Captain went down but did not strike
 & he came on board & there was whales all around &c
 Middle part very good weather & we were under short
 sail & Latter part good weather & we made sail & at
 7 P.M. we raised 2 right whales & we loosed 1 gallicid
 & we came on board & pretty soon we loosed again &c

Monday Jan 28

The first part of these 24 hours strong winds & we
 went whaling & we loosed 1 gallicid & came on board &
 pretty soon we loosed again & our second mate struck
 the whale but right to the windward & it was raff
 enough but he soon landed him & then out & we got
 him & at 7 P.M. I flagged the Steward today &c
 Middle part strong winds but good weather & we had
 4 whale long side &c Latter part good weather &
 & we were employed at cutting in our whale &c
