The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we were employed at ships duties. No fishing &c.

Middle part good weather &c.

Leather part same squally & about 10 A.M. we weighed our anchors & put to sea

Sunday June 2nd -

The first part of these 24 hours squally with rain &c. Middle part the same & the wind increases & we are under short sail. Leather part it was blowing a gale from the E. & we were under a close reef main & topsail &c.

Monday June 3rd -

The first part of these 24 hours blowing a gale & we were lying too under a close reef main & topsail. Middle part the same. Leather part same better & we made same sail & our men have been employed at ships duties &c.

Tuesday June 4th 1867

The first part of these 24 hours good weather & we are under double reef topsails & steering N.E. &c. Middle part squally with rain. & we were under short sail. Leather part the same & our men have been employed at ships duties &c. & we are heading off to the N.E.

Wednesday June 5th -

The first part of these 24 hours squally with rain & we were under short sail & heading to the N. & eastward & our men have been employed at ships duties not doing much. Middle part good weather & we were under short sail. Leather part pleasant & we made all sail & steered N. & our men have been employed at ships duties &c.

Thursday June 6th -

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we had all sail set & steering N. & our men have been employed at ships duties. Middle part pleasant with a light breeze & we were under short sail & steering N. &c.

On Board Bark *Am Barker* & on New Zealand ground

Leather part pleasant with a light breeze from the N. & we had all sail set & heading to the E. & our men have been employed at painting boats &c.

Friday June 7th 1867

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant with a light breeze from the N. & we had all sail set &c. Middle part pleasant with a light breeze from the N. & we were under short sail & our flood boats crew watches. Leather part pleasant with a light breeze & we had all sail set & heading to the N. & our men have been employed at ships duties painting the Starboard &c.

Saturday June 8th -

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant with a light breeze & we had all sail set & our men have been employed at ships duties. & at 1 P.M. we shortened sail &c. Middle part pleasant with a light breeze & we were under short sail & hauled aback all night. Leather part strong breezes & we triced forward & made sail & our men have been employed at ships duties &c.

Sunday June 9th 1867

The first part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the N. & our men have been employed at ships duties & at 1 P.M. we shortened sail & close reefed. Middle part strong winds & squally with rain. Leather part blowing a gale from the E. & we were lying too under a close reef main & topsail &c. same rainy

Monday June 10th -

The first part of these 24 hours blowing a gale from the E. & we were lying too under a close reef main & topsail &c. Middle part the same &c. Leather part it moderated a little so that we made a little sail & our men at our mast heads & broke out water &c.

Tuesday June 11th 1867

The first part of these 24 hours strong breezes & we were under close reef topsails & employed at ships duties &c.
