 to the eastward & about 8 A.M. we raised a sail off our
 weather beam & gamened her towed the Bartholomew Gannet

 Middle part good weather & we were under short sail

Monday July 8-1867

The first part of these 24 hours strong winds & we were
 under short sail & P.M. we took in about all sail we kept
 out the main topsail & that we close reefed &c
 Middle part strong winds & squally & we were under short
 Latter part the same but it rather in clines to moderate
 & our men have been employed at Ships duties
