Monday September 30-1867
The first part of these 24 hours Strong winds & we were employed at cutting in our whale & at 7 P. M. we knocked off cutting in till morning. Middle part Strong winds & raining & we were under Bare boards lying by our whale & we Latter part the same only blowing heavier & more rain so we could not cut in our whale & the ship Milton was lost too & we

Tuesday September October 1-1867
The first part of these 24 hours Strong winds & raining & we were under bare boards lying by our whale & we could not cut in & the Milton lost too. Middle part the weather moderated & we Latter part we went to cutting again & we

Wednesday October 2-1867
The first part of these 24 hours good weather & we were employed at cutting in our whale & the captain of the Milton came on board & stopped till dark & then we was all taken with the case & showed it over board & went to trying out. Middle part good weather & we were employed at trying out our whale & we

Thursday October 3-1867
The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we were under short sail & employed at trying out our whale & we Middle part the same

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Latter part the same

Friday October 4-1867
The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we were employed at trying out our whale & at 7 P. M. we finished & we Middle part pleasant & we Latter part pleasant & we gave the ship Milton half of the whale which was 55 barrels & we had a gammon with her the rest part of the day & we

Saturday October 5-1867
The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we were gamming with the ship Milton & we Middle part pleasant & we Latter part the same & we were employed at stopping down our oil & the ship Milton was not far off and all quiet & we

Sunday October 6-1867
The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & calm & we were employed at making ship inside & at 3 P. M. we finished & the ship Milton not far off and all quiet & we Middle part pleasant & we were under easy sail Latter part pleasant & we made all sail & the ship Milton the same & we

Monday October 7-1867
The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we had all sail set & the ship Milton the same. Middle part pleasant & we were under easy sail & we Latter part pleasant & we made all sail & the ship Milton was not far off & our men have been employed at cutting up catch & mending our bow

Tuesday October 8-1867
The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we had all sail set & the Milton was the same & about 11 A. M. we raised the ship gambold coming down & we three ships all had a gammon
