The first part of these 24 hours strong breeze from the N.W. & we were heading to the S.W. & C. Four men have been employed at ships duties & the middle part strong wind from the N.W. & we were under short sail & heading S.E. & W. on the morning. Latter part the same & we raised 2 humpbacks breaching &c.

Sunday October 27-1867

The first part of these 24 hours strong breeze from the N.W. & we were under short sail & heading to the South & C. Middle part good weather & we were under short sail. Latter part good weather & we made sail & C.

Monday October 28-1867

The first part of these 24 hours good weather & about 12 m. we took our ship to the N. with the wind from the N.W. & at 1 P.M. we shortened sail & C. Middle part good weather & we were under short sail. Latter part good weather & we made sail & headed about N.W. on the part took & wind about N.E. & C. Four men have been employed at ships duties & C.

Tuesday October 29-1867

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant about all sail set & heading about N.W. & wind from the N.W. & four men have been employed at ships duties & C. Middle part good weather & we were under short sail. Latter part pleasant & we made all sail & C. & C. about calm & not much doing & C.

Wednesday October 30-1867

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant with a light breeze from the N. & we were steering S.E. & W. & at 7 P.M. we shortened sail & C. headed our foretop sail & courses & C. Middle part rainy & we were under a double reef main top sail & C. steering S.E. & W. with the wind from the E. & C. breeze on & C. Latter part blowing strong & we close reef our main top sail & made every thing ready for a gale & C.

Thursday October 31-1867

The first part of these 24 hours blowing strong from the E. until about three P.M. then the wind shifted around to the W. & C. blew strong & we were under a close reef. Main top sail lying too & C. Middle part strong wind from the S. & we were lying to under a close reef, main top sail & heading to the E. & C. Latter part the weather moderated & we made sail & headed to the S.E. & C. the wind from the S.W. & our men have been employed at ships duties & C.

Friday November 1-1867

The first part of these 24 hours fair weather with the wind from the South & we were heading to the S.E. & C. Middle part strong wind & some squalls. We were under short sail. Latter part strong breeze from the South & quite calm & we were under double reef top sails heading to the West. By the wind & our men have been employed at ships duties & C.

Saturday November 2-1867

The first part of these 24 hours good weather but a heavy sea running & we made sail & kept off before the wind heading N. & our men have been employed at ships duties & C. Middle part pleasant & we were steering N. & wind from the South. Latter part the same & we were employed at ships duties & C.

Sunday November 3-1867

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant with a light breeze from the South & we had all sail set & steering N. & our men have been employed at ships duties & C. Middle part pleasant & we were steering N. with the wind from the South & C. carrying our top sail & C. Latter part the same only steering N.E. & C. (Long 129.26 W Lat 28.52 S)

Monday November 4-1867

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we were steering N.E. by C. with the wind from the South. Middle part pleasant & we were under short sail & steering N.E. & C. Latter part pleasant & we made all sail & C. by the wind heading N.E. on the Starboard tack & C. Island in sight & head & C.
