Middle & latter part pleasant weather & we were employed at trying out our whale & we were steering S. W. for manganni with the wind from the North W. &c.

Wednesday November 13-1867

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant until about 5 P.M. but it became little squally with rain not much & we were employed at trying out our whale. At 6 P.M. we double reefed our topsails & still steering S. W. for manganni with the wind from the North W. &c.

Middle part good weather & we were under short sail trying. Latter part the same & we were still employed at trying out our whale & the weather became rainy N.E. &c.

Thursday November 14-1867

The first part of these 24 hours good weather but some cloudy. We finished trying out our whale & we are steering S. W. for manganni & the wind from the North. Middle part it came on stormy & blowed heavy & we close reefed our main topsail & perked off the other sails & let her by. Latter part the same & we lashed our aft chub & let her by heading to the S. W. on the Port tack & about 80 miles from manganni & bound in there.

Friday November 15-1867

The first part of these 24 hours strong from the S.E. & we were lying to under a close reef main topsail & on the Port tack. Middle part the same part of the time & the weather moderated down. We made some sail & headed N.E. W. but the wind on the Port tack. Latter part good weather & we were employed at stowing down our sail & we headed to the N.E. W. on the Port tack by the wind & our course is S.E. E. for manganni which we are bound for N.E. &c.

Saturday November 16-1867

The first part of these 24 hours good weather & we were under short sail & employed at stowing down our sail & we were about 4 P.M. we were here heading to the W. on the Port tack & our course is S.E. E. for manganni which we are bound for. Middle part good weather & we were under short sail & Latter part pleasant & we made all sail & headed N.E. & manganni & light off our weather & another wind from the S. & we were on the Port tack.

Sunday November 17-1867

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we have all sail set & heading S. by W. & on the Port tack & manganni is in sight about 3 points off our weather bow which we are bound for.

Middle part good weather & we were beating up to manganni which is not more than 30 miles off & another beam & Latter part pleasant & we went into manganni about 11 A.M. & anchored ship. &c.

Monday November 18-1867

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we were lying at anchor in manganni N.E. &c. Middle part good weather & we at anchor in manganni. Latter part the same & we were employed at getting off a raft of water &c. &c.

Tuesday November 19-1867

The first part of these 24 hours strong breezes & raining & we were at anchor in manganni & employed at stowing down water &c. Middle part strong breezes from the W. & Latter part strong wind & especially with rain & we were still lying at anchor in manganni & nothing doing &c.

Wednesday November 20-1867

The first part of these 24 hours strong wind & squally with rain & we were at anchor in manganni & nothing doing &c. Middle & latter part the same only strong & strong.

Thursday November 21-1867

The first part of these 24 hours storming heavy & squally with rain & we were lying at anchor in manganni & Middle part good weather & the weather moderated down. Latter part good weather & we weighed our anchor & put to sea & employed at putting our anchor on the bow &c. &c.

Friday November 22-1867

The first part of these 24 hours good weather & we were under close reef topsails & off the north Cape of New Zealand not far off. One top sail Schooner passed close to us &c.
