Wednesday December 11-18.07

The first part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the N.E. & we were steering to the South & westward & our men have been employed at ship duties & at 4 P.M. we were under short sail & on the starboard tack. Latter part the same & one large Stromer in sight off our bow she was head about W by N. & C. King's.

Thursday December 12-18.07

The first part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the N.E. & we were under short sail & flying. Middle part good weather & we were under short sail. Latter part squally & raining & we raised a English Whaling bark & we jammed her. She was to north & out.

Friday December 13-18.07

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we were under short sail & jamming a English man & we raised another sail & at 11 o'clock at night we came on board. Middle part pleasant & we were under short sail. Latter part pleasant & we made sail & the same. We were employed at ship duties & C. & C.

Saturday December 14-18.07

The first part pleasant & 2 sails in sight & we have been employed at ship duties & Middle part strong winds & squally. Latter part good weather & we jammed the runnymede & she is a English bark from Fisher Town & we sighted the James Arnold early this morning & C. & C.

Sunday December 15-18.07

The first part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the W. & we were steering N.E. & jamming with the runnymede & about 4 P.M. we raised finbacks & board our boats & took them. To the sperm whales N.E. & C. Middle part strong breezes from the W. & we were under short sail. Latter part strong breezes part of the time & we made sail & steered N.E. & the runnymede the same & C.

Monday December 16-18.07

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant weather with the wind from the W. & we were steering N.E. & the runnymede the same & Middle part calm part of the time & then it breezed up strong from the N. & we were under short sail. Latter part strong breezes & raining & we were under short sail & heading to the eastward & wind from the N. & C.

Tuesday December 17-18.07

The first part of these 24 hours strong breezes & squally & we were under short sail heading to the eastward & at 4 P.M. we raised a brig off our weather beam & C. & C. Middle part strong breezes from the S. & we were under short sail & heading to the South on the starboard tack. Latter part strong breezes from the S. & we made some sail & steered N.E. & we have had all hands employed at mending our mainsail & the weather moderates some & C.

Wednesday December 18-18.07

The first part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the S. & we were steering to the N.E. & our men have been employed at mending our mainsail & at 4 P.M. we pinkerhed it & bent it again & C. Middle part strong breezes from the S. & we were under short sail & heading to the N. & by the wind on the port tack & C. & C. Latter part pleasant & we made all sail & steered to the N.E. & we have been employed at mending our main topail. we had all hands & some of them have been employed at repairing our ship & part & flushing them & C. & C.
