Topsail & employed at trying out our whales the
Middle part squally with rain & we were under short
sail & employed at trying out our whales the
Latter part strong breezes & we were still employed at
trying out & about 6 A.M. we raised 3 sperm whales going to
the windward we hoard all 4 boats & chased but did not
get any & the ship Milton came in sight the

chasing whales but did not get any & we were still
employed at trying out & we finished the Milton & we
saw the bark Robert Towns the
Middle part strong winds from the S.E. & we were under
short sail & employed at trying out our whales & gamming

Latter part strong winds from the S.E. & we were under short

under short sail lying by our whales the
Latter part strong winds from the N.W. & we were under
short sail & employed at cutting in our whales the

The first part of these 24 hours good weather & we were
employed at cutting in our whales & we finished about
5 P.M. & started the work.

Middle part strong winds from the N.W. & we were employed
at trying out our whales & the weather came bad & rainy but
it did not last long Latter part strong winds from the
S.W. & we made same sail & started to the N.W. & we
were employed at trying out our whales & slowing down
oil & water the

The first part of these 24 hours strong winds from the S.W.
we were steering to the N.W. & we had all hands employed
at trying out & slowing down our oil the
Middle part strong winds from the South & we were under
a close reef main & topsail & employed at trying out our
whales & Latter part the same & we made same
sail & started N.W. by E. & employed at trying
out our whales the
