The first part of these 24 hours pleasant with the wind from the west & we were heading to the North & at 6 P. M. we shortened sail & the middle part pleasant & we were under short sail & the latter part pleasant & we made sail & headed to the North & our men have been employed at ship duties &c.

Saturday June 27 - 1868

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant with the wind from the North & our men have been employed at ship duties &c. At 3 P. M. we raised a sail & a head & we are going to speak her & about 6 P. M. we spoke her & the Hunter was jammed with her & the middle part pleasant & we were under short sail & the latter part pleasant & about 10 P. M. we made all sail & the Hunter the same & our men have been employed at ship duties &c.

Sunday June 28 - 1868

The first part of these 24 hours calm & about 3 P. M. we jammed with the Hunter & carried a sack of potatoes on board & a piece of Pig &c. At 6 P. M. we shortened sail & the middle part pleasant & about 10 P. M. we were under short sail & the latter part pleasant & we made all sail & the Hunter &c.

Monday June 29 - 1868

The first part of these 24 hours light breeze & thick & some rain by 4 P. M. it cleared off & rain & at 6 P. M. we shortened sail & the middle part pleasant & we were under short sail & the latter part pleasant & we made all sail & the Hunter &c. And we have had all hands on deck all day employed at mending our four & masts & sail & sent them &c.

Wednesday July 1 - 1868

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we had all sail set & heading to the north & our men have been employed at ship duties &c. At 6 P. M. we shortened sail & the middle part pleasant & we were under short sail & the latter part pleasant & we made sail & headed to the south by the wind on the starboard tack & our men have been employed at ship duties &c.

Thursday July 2 - 1868

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant with the wind from the south & we were on the starboard tack by the wind & trying to get to the south but we had a head wind & at 6 P. M. we shortened sail & tacked ship & headed to the south by the wind & our men have been employed at ship duties &c. The middle part calm & we were under short sail & the latter part calm & we made sail & headed to the P. M. by the wind on the port tack & our men have been employed at ship duties &c.

Friday July 3 - 1868

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we had all sail set & heading to the S. W. by the wind on the port tack & our men have been employed at ship duties &c. At 6 P. M. we shortened sail & the middle part calm & we were under short sail & the latter part pleasant & we made all sail & headed to the S.
