Sunday July 12th 1868

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant with the wind from the west but were steering eastward N. by E. for our men have been employed at ship's duties. Middle part pleasant with the wind from the South by west steering N. N. W. for Eoa. Latter part the same & lots of fish catch in sight.

Monday July 13th 1868

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant but had all chills set & steering N. N. W. for Eoa which we raised about 2 P.M. right ahead & E. & C. D. D. Nine hundred over light sails & Eoa not far off. an over lay low W.

Middle part strong winds from the South by west under short sail & sight of Eoa & sailing for Eoa. Latter part strong breezes from the South by west into Eoa. & the first thing was 2 gales came along side & our Captain went ashore & E.

Tuesday July 14th 1868

The first part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the South by west lying off Van Eoa. till dark then our Captain came on board & E. Middle part good weather & we were lying off Van Eoa. Latter part the same & our Captain went on shore again & trading with the natives & E.

Wednesday July 15th 1868

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we were lying off Van Eoa & trading with the natives & E. D. M. we got there & started for Mangani. Middle part pleasant & we were under all sail & steering South from Eoa. Rain was from the North. Latter part the same & our men have been employed at ship's duties & such as skirting and oranges & yams & E.

Thursday July 16th 1868

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we were under all sail & steering South & our men have been employed at pulling away & rearranging. Middle part strong breezes from the S. E. & we were on the port tack by the wind & our men were employed at duties. Latter part the same only blowing stronger & we had to double reef topsails & our men were employed at ship's duties.

Friday July 17th 1868

The first part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the S. E. & we were on the port tack by the wind & our men have been employed at ship's duties & E. Middle part the same & we are bound for Mangani. Latter part strong breezes from the S. E. & we were on the port tack by the wind & for Mangani.

Saturday July 18th 1868

The first part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the S. E. & we were on the port tack by the wind & E. Middle part strong breezes from the S. E. & we were steering S. S. W. for Mangani. Latter part the same only not so much wind & E.

Sunday July 19th 1868

The first part of these 24 hours good weather with the wind from the Eastward & we headed to the wind on the port tack & our men have been employed at ship's duties. Middle part good weather & we were under short sail & E. Latter part pleasant & about calm & we made sail & headed to the South & E.

Monday July 20th 1868

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & about calm & we had all sail set except foretop gallant sail & E. Middle part good weather & we were under short sail. Latter part strong winds from the South & we were under double reef topsails by the wind on the port tack & E.
