Thursday July 21st 1868

The first part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the South & we were under double reef topsails by the wind on the Port tack & C. P. Home close reefed our main topsail & fished the four topsail. Middle part strong breezes from the S. E. & we were on the port tack by the wind under a close reef main topsail & foresail & C. P. Home equally & C. Scatter part about the same kind of weather & we made some more sail & double reef topsails & C. P. Home sent down our mainsail & went to mending of it the wind from the S. E. & C. P. Home

Wednesday July 22nd 1868

The first part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the S. E. & we were under double reef topsails by the wind on the Port tack & our men have been employed at mending our mainsail & C. P. Home headed our four topsails & C. Scatter part strong breezes from the East & we were under short sail from the port tack & C. Scatter part good weather & we were under double reef topsails & steering S. E. with the wind from N. E. & C. P. Home men have been employed at mending our old spanker & finishing of our mainsail & sent it off

Thursday July 23rd 1868

The first part of these 24 hours good weather & we were under double reef topsails & C. P. Home steering S. E. & our men have been employed at mending our old spanker & C. P. Home fished the mainsail & C. Scatter part strong breezes from the S. E. & we were under double reef topsails & steering S. E. & C. P. Home Scatter the same only we made more sail & our men have been employed at making foot matts & C.

Friday July 24th 1868

The first part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the North & we were steering S. E. & C. P. Home we hoisted our boats upon the high cranes & luffed to the wind on the Starboard tack under a close reef

Middle part strong breezes & raining & we were under a close reef main topsail & heading to the West & the wind was from the N. W. & C.

Saturday July 25th 1868

The first part of these 24 hours (thick & raining) & we were under a close reef main topsail & heading to the S. W. on the Starboard tack by the wind & C. Scatter part strong wind & equally & with the wind from the North & we were under a close reef main topsail & C. Scatter part it blowed a gale & raining & we were lying two under a close reef main topsail & C.

Sunday July 26th 1868

The first part of these 24 hours it was blowing a gale from the N. E. & we were lying two under a close reef main topsail & C. Scatter part it was blowing a gale from the N. E. & we were lying two under a close reef main topsail & C. Scatter part for a while it was clear & better but made a little more sail & headed to S. E. & we started tack trying to get to mangani New Zealand & C.

Monday July 27th 1868

The first part of these 24 hours blowing a gale from the West & we were lying two under a close reef main topsail on the Starboard tack heading about S. E. & C. Scatter part blowing a gale from the North & we were lying two under a close reef main topsail & C. Scatter part it moderated & we made some sail & the wind blew round to the West & C. to S. E.

Tuesday July 28th 1868

The first part of these 24 hours strong wind from the North & we were under double reef topsails & heading to the S. E. by the wind on the port tack & at 4 P. M. we tacked ship & headed too the port & we made some more sail & C. Scatter part strong breezes from the North & we had all sail set that we could carry & C. Scatter part for some only we made all sail & we raised the land a head
