Thursday January 16-1869
The first part of these 24 hours strong winds from the
Westward were under double reef topsails & full & the Milton
the same P.M. we shortened our sails & full
Middle part strong winds from the E. & S. E.
Scatter part about the same we made all sail & the Milton
was not far off the E. E.

Friday January 17-1869
The first part of these 24 hours strong winds from
the Eastward were under double reef topsails &
to Cardal to Milton not far off we sighted another
sail P.M. at 7 P.M. we shortened sail & E.
Middle part strong winds we were under short sail
Scatter part strong winds we made some sail
& the Milton the same & we sighted another ship off
two the toward of us P.M.

Saturday January 18-1869
The first part of these 24 hours strong winds from
the S. E. we were under double reef topsails & Cardal
Milton the same P.M. we shortened sail & E.
Middle part strong winds P.M. we
Scatter part the same we made some sail &
the Milton the same & the Milton was in sight & E.

Sunday January 19-1869
The first part of these 24 hours quite a squall
about P.M. we jammed the Milton & stayed
all night Middle part pleasant & E.
Scatter part pleasant & several ships were in
sight & we were still jamming & E.

Monday January 20-1869
The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & about
noon P.M. we saw a firm whaler full coast all
our boat from both ships we got one in company
with the Milton & several other ships, pleasant
& P.M. we helped out him in got Middle
Scatter part pleasant & several ships in sight & E.

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Tuesday January 21-1869
The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we were under
all sail & at 6 P.M. we went on board the Milton &
Carried some of our coal for oil & E.
Middle part strong winds with rain & we were not
far from the Milton & E.
Scatter part about calm we made sail & the Milton
not far off the E.

Wednesday January 22-1869
The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & about
calm we were not far off the Milton & at 7 P.M.
we shortened sail & our carpenter has been employed
at mending our waste boat P.M. & E.
Middle part pleasant & we were under short sail & E.
Scatter part the same we made all sail & the Milton
was not far off & still sailing & E. & E.

Thursday January 23-1869
The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we were
under all sail & the Milton is not far off & still
sailing & our men have been employed at ship
P.M. at 7 P.M. we shortened sail & E.
Middle part pleasant & about calm we were under short sail
Scatter part pleasant & we made all sail & we jammed
with the Milton & we took our oil on board from the
Milton & then we went down to the north light
& had a jam & several other ships were in sight & E.

Friday January 24-1869
The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we have all
sail & all were jamming with the Milton &
north light & several other ships were in sight
& E. Middle part pleasant & we were under short
sail Scatter part pleasant & we made all sail & the
Milton & north light were in sight & E. & E. & E.
Milton id about starting for home & E.
