

on Board Bark *Abner Barker* making a passage ^{to manganni}

Sunday June 30 - 1869

The first part of these 24 hours light winds & thick & rainy weather & we were under double reef topsails. Your courses hauled up waiting for it to clear up so we can go into manganni &c &c

Middle part strong breeze & we squally. Latter part the clouds were raised or dispersed in wind about 10. A.M. off our weather bow & we were under double reef topsails & (waked) that is quite enough for the breeze &c.

Monday June 30 - 1869

The first part of these 24 hours strong breeze from the N. & we were heaving up to manganni which is in sight to the windward of us &c

Middle part pleasant & we were under all sail & working up to manganni harbor &c about 3. A.M. our Captain board down a boat & went on shore & the ship was lying off & on manganni &c &c

Tuesday June 1 - 1869

The first part of these 24 hours strong breeze & squally with rain & the wind was from the N. & we were trying to get clear from the land our courses is N.E. &c

Middle part light winds & rainy & thick & we were for some time. Latter part squally & rainy & then again it would be calm. There was 3 sails in sight all merchant vessels & 1 or 2 ships were in sight & the weather was rather baffling & we were trying to get to the N. bound for Wapalee & Carl's Bay &c

Wednesday June 1 - 1869

The first part of these 24 hours strong breeze from the N. & we were steering N.E. bound for Wapalee. Middle & latter part pleasant with fine wind from the N. & we were steering N.E. by N. & our men have been employed at ship's duties

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Thursday June 3 - 1869

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we were under all sail & steering N.E. by N. for Wapalee ground. Middle part pleasant & we were under all sail & steering N.E. by N. with the wind from the N. &c. Latter part the same & our men were employed at picking over our potatoes &c &c

Friday June 4 - 1869

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant with the wind from the N. & we were steering N.E. & E. &c. Middle part strong winds & squally with lightning & with the wind from the N. & we were steering N.E. & E. &c. Latter part the same & our men were employed at tending our fields &c. strong breeze from the N. &c

Saturday June 5 - 1869

The first part of these 24 hours strong winds from the N. & we were steering about O. for Wapalee island & our men have been employed at tending our fields &c at O. & Home, shortened sail &c. Middle part strong winds from the N. & we were lying with our main yard & back &c. Latter part blowing a gale from the N. & we were running before the wind under double reef main topsail & fore sail & about 10. A.M. we sighted Sunday Island

Sunday June 6 - 1869

The first part of these 24 hours blowing strong from the N. & we were steering N.E. under double reef main topsail & fore sail & about 10. A.M. we hauled our fore sail & close reefed our main topsail & heaved to the wind on the port tack &c. Middle part strong winds from the S. & we were lying to under close reef main topsail &c. Latter part strong breeze from the South & we made sail & steered N. & the weather was moderating & became quite good weather only it left a heavy cloud
