Thursday July ^{the} 8th 1869

The first part of Hble 24. Thos. pleasant. 74 men
employed at whaling but we were not very successful
had too many on board without any whale &c &c
Middle part pleasant & about calm & 10 Mon
30th crews 90
Latter part good weather but we were under all sail
D. Herking to S. H. for many an hour but we have a horse

Friday July 7th 1869

The first part of the 24 hours good weather & we
were working to the S. W. far mangani but we
have a head wind & about 3. P. M. we saw some
Whales which we called sperm whales & we chased 2 boats
But did not succeed & so
Middle part Strong winds & storm & finally bore more
trying to get to the S. W. but we have a head wind &
 Latter part Some better but made a little more shift
Four men have been employed at mending our old
gustaf sail & on the Part took & holding down the

Saturday July 10th 1869

The first part of the 3d hour good weather
And our men have been employed at fixing our
rafts till about 3. P.M. we saw a long sperm whale
about 1/2 of our boat, & pulled to the surface
& apparently the whale was still but we he saw up he
threw long spouts off to the windward & did not let him
Middle part Some squally with the wind from the N.E.
S. have are trying to get to mangrove over side in S.W.
Leath's part pleasant & more all still due heads
Came for mangrove with the wind about N.E. & about
11. A.M. we sighted sperm whales have coasted &
caught one & I

Sunday July ^{the} 11th 1869

The first part of these 24 hours good weather & we
were employed at unloading & cargo
Hid. M. part we were lying by our side & a
small part of daybreak & commenced cutting in our

The first part of June 24 hours I was employed at
me more employed at gunnelling cutting in and out of
the first it very heavy boat raising & our ship
was in the To under bare poles I was more standing
Boat crew matches & the latter part about the same

Tuesday July 23rd 1869

The 1st part of the 22 hours towing strong and
started our works Valcott 3, P. 10 m. ship took 10 m.
Water & it was rough weather but we load & stowed and
four line, started & we lost him. The weather is
moderating & we are employed at trying out our cable
on Middle & Letter part. The ship only the weather
was growing better & (C)

Wednesday July 14th 1869

The first part of the 24 hours & good weather & our
were employed at trying out our whale
Middle part the same only the weather was not so fine
You finished trying out our whale at day break &c
 Latter part we were employed at cleaning up &c

Thursday July 15th 1869

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant business
were employed at clearing up things the 2nd
& 3rd part pleasant but were under short sail
the latter part pleasant but made sail & heaved to about
5 P.M. by the wind as the Port tack frame were
all employed at blowing down our sail etc

Friday July 16. 1869

The first part of the 14th Novr good weather & we
were employed at finishing stowing down our oil &c
were finished about 2 P.M. & stowing by the
wind on the Port tack & heading about S. E.
N. by E. port strong wind & some squally with
the wind from the W. the 15th Novr calm at 11
Leather part about a gale was blowing & raining & we
went to lying down to clear our main topsails &c & cleared
away our rigging.
