Latter part the same & our men were employed at
setting up our four rigging

Thursday September 30-1869

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we had all
sail set & steering N.E. by N. with the wind from the
S.W. middle part pleasant with a light breeze from the S.W.
& we had all sail set & steering N.E. by N. for Varasco
Latter part the same & our men were employed at ship's
duties &c setting up our four rigging &c

Friday October 1-1869

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we had all
sail set & steering N.E. by N. for Varasco & our men were
employed at setting up our four rigging &c &c
Middle part pleasant with the wind from the S.W. &
we had all sail set & steering N.E. by N. for Varasco
Latter part the same & our men were employed at
ship's duties &c

Saturday October 2-1869

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant with the
wind from the S.W. & we had all sail set & steering
N.E. by E. Middle part squally & some rain with the wind
from the S.W. & we had all sail set & steering N.E. by E. for Varasco
about 3 A.M. we shortened sail & heaved to the wind on
the Starboard tack with our head yards aback & it raining
Latter part soon as we could steam up on our
old course & made sail & our men have been employed
at ship's duties &c &c Strong winds with squalls
from the South &c &c

Sunday October 3-1869

The first part of these 24 hours strong breeze from the S.W.
& we were steering N. for Varasco which are lighted about one
P.M. & we ran close down to it & then heaved to the wind
& shortened sail & tomorrow we will try to go into anchor &c
Middle part strong winds & squally & we were under short sail
& lying off & on Varasco &c
Latter part strong breeze & squally & we were beating up
into Varasco harbor & our captain took a boat to crew to
visit a shore after a pilot &c

Monday October 4-1869

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we were employed
at working our ship into Varasco harbor & we anchored
about 3 P.M. &c

Tuesday October 5-1869

The first part of these 24 hours with good weather
& we weighed anchor & put to sea from Varasco
& left our great boat behind us & we took a
raft of water on board & then appeared in our yard
& we have been in Varasco 10 days & we have
consumed about 1000 barrels of oil &c

Wednesday October 6-1869

The first part of these 24 hours strong winds
& some squally & we were putting to sea with a fair
wind &c Middle part strong breeze from the S.W.
& we were lying aback all night &c
Latter part strong winds & we made sail &
steered S.W. by W. with the wind from the S.W. & our
men have been employed at sailing out fruit &c

Thursday October 7-1869

The first part of these 24 hours strong winds
from the S.W. & we were steering S.W. by W. & our men
have been employed at sailing out our potatoes &c
Middle part pleasant & we had all sail set & steering
S.W. by W. Latter part the same with the wind from
the S.W. & our men have been employed at ship's duties
