The first part of these 24 hours good weather & we
 had all sail set & heading to the S.W. by the
 wind on the starboard tack & still jamming
 at 7 P.M. we shortened sail & our captain went on board
 the Carol & the weather looks rather threatening & it
 Middle part strong wind & it was threatening
 lightning & we were under short sail & it
 Latter part strong breeze & we made some sail
 & the Carol the same & we had a squall from the East
 & we have been going by the wind on the Port tack heading
 about N.W. in company with the Carol & it

Thursday November 12-1869

The first part of these 24 hours strong breeze from
 the South & we were under easy sail & by the wind on
 the Port tack heading about N. by E. the Carol is
 not far off & it
 Middle part strong wind from the South & we
 were under short sail on the Port tack by the wind
 Latter part the same & we made some sail & we
 men have been employed at ship's duties & it

 Middle part pleasant & we were under short sail & it
 Latter part pleasant & we made all sail & started by
 the wind on the Port tack heading from S.W. to N.W.
 jamming with the Carol & it

Sunday November 14-1869

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we had all
 sail set & steering by the wind on the Port tack &
 heading about S.W. & jamming with the Carol & it
 at 6 P.M. we shortened sail & it
 Middle part pleasant & we were under short sail & it
 steering by the wind heading to the westward in company
 Latter part the same & we made all sail & it was
 very light & we saw one humpback & still jamming

Monday November 15-1869

The first part of these 24 hours pleasant & we had
 all sail set & we were in company with the Carol &
 jamming with her & P.M. we shortened sail & it
 Middle part pleasant & we were under short sail & it was
 a calm all night & we were up jamming about 12 o'clock
 Latter part pleasant & we had all sail & started
 By the wind on the starboard tack heading about
 N.W. with the Carol is not far off & about 10 A.M. we
 sent our new main sail & foremast stay sail & it

Tuesday November 16-1869

The first part of these 24 hours strong breeze & we had
 to shorten sail & we were by the wind on the starboard
 tack heading about S.W. & Carol is not far off
 Middle part strong wind from the South & we were
 under short sail & by the wind heading S.W. by E.
 Latter part the same & we made a little more sail &
 were ship & headed to the westward by the wind & in company
 with the Carol & it
