Middle part strong trade & we are steering N. E. & E.
For the part about the same we had every thing set & we

Monday April 18. 1870
The first part of these 24 hours strong S.E. Trades breeze had
blow but not so strong N. N.E. & E.
Middle part strong trade winds S.E. Trades breeze more
strong N by E with a light S.W. & S.E.
 Latter part about calm & baffling winds or old drizzle
Four men have been employed at ships duties &c
