

Ship Cambria from New Bedford towards the Pacific ^{Ocean}

Saturday Feb. 11th 1843 Commences with a brisk trade from the S.E. with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the larboard tacks aboard hoisted out the Black Fish saw a Ship steering to the North, middle and latter part brisk trades and pleasant so ends.

Lat by Obs. 20.39 N Long by Chit. 22.43 West.

Sunday Feb. 12th 1843 All these 24 hours brisk trades from the S.E. with fair weather steering S.W. by S so ends Lat by Obs. 21 South Long by Chit. 24.00

Monday February 13th 1843 All these 24 hours brisk trades from the S.E. with pleasant weather steering S.W. by S so ends.

Lat by Obs. 23.33 S Long by Chit. 25.21

Tuesday Feb. 14th 1843 All these 24 hours brisk trades from the S.E. with fine pleasant weather steering by the wind with all sails set to the best advantage so ends. Lat by Obs. 25.15 Long by Chit. 27.00

Wednesday February 15th 1843 All these 24 hours moderate trades from S.E. by S steering by the wind with the larboard tacks aboard latter part sun showers of rain so ends

Lat by Obs. 27.06 Long by Chit. 28.10

Thursday Feb. 16th 1843 All these 24 hours brisk trades from the S.E. with fine pleasant weather steering S.W. by S. so ends

Lat by Obs. 29.12 Long by Chit. 29.24

Friday Feb. 17th 1843 Commences with a moderate trade from the S.E. with pleasant weather steering S.W. by S middle part much the same at 6 A.M. set the Top mast and J.G. Standing Sails latter part brisk trades from S.E. saw a Bar 10 ends. Lat by Obs. 31.35 Long 30.46

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Saturday Feb. 18th 1843 Commences with a brisk trade from the S.E. with pleasant weather steering S.W. by S at 5 P.M. the wind halled to the S.E. halled in the Standing Sails middle part more moderate at 3 A.M. the wind halled to S.E. set the Standing Sails at 8 A.M. had a Squall halled in the J.G. Standing Sail at 9 A.M. saw a break off the lee Seem kept off and run until we judged ourselves up with it luffed to the wind with the Main Top Sail to the mast but saw nothing more at half past 10 kept the Ship S.W. by S at 12 set the Top mast Standing Sails so ends.

Lat by Obs. 13.44 Long by Chit. 31.58

Sunday February 19th 1843 Commences with a brisk trade from S.E. by E with fair weather steering S.W. by S one vessel in sight at 5 P.M. set the No. 1 & 2 Standing Sails middle part much as the first at 6 A.M. passed a Ship on opposite tacks that showed French Colors latter part moderate so ends Lat by Obs. 15.51 S Long by Chit. 33.30 West

Monday Feb. 20th 1843 Commences with a very moderate breeze from S.E. with pleasant weather steering S.W. by S middle part wind N.E. by N latter part wind from N.W. & ends.

Lat by Obs. 17.00 Long by Chit. 34.43

Tuesday Feb. 21st 1843 Commences with a moderate breeze from the North with pleasant weather middle part much the same latter part thick raining & squally wind halled round to the South by the West put 2 reefs in the Top Sails so ends a Sail in sight to the N.W. No Observation

Wednesday Feb. 22nd 1843 Commences with a brisk wind from the S.E. with cloudy weather steering by the wind with the starboard tacks aboard at 5 P.M. veered Ship middle part more moderate turned the reef out latter part calm so ends Lat by Obs. 19.35 Long 35.30 West.
