

Ship Cambria from New Bedford towards the ^{Ocean} Pacific

Thursday Feb. 23rd 1843

Commences with a calm middle and latter part light
air from S.W. steering by the wind with the larboard
tacks aboard one vessel in sight steering to the N.E.
so ends Lat by Obs. 18.45 Long by Chrt. 55.40

Friday Feb. 24th 1843 first and
middle part vary light air from the S.W. with pleasant
weather latter part moderate breezes from N.W. steering
S.W. topmast and S.B. Standing Sails set cloudy weather
so ends Lat by Obs. 20.40 South.

Saturday February 25th 1843
Commences with a moderate breeze from the N.W.
with cloudy weather at 4 P.M. the wind halled more to
the Westward halled in the S.B. Standing Sails middle part
vary moderate at 6 P.M. the wind veered to N.W. set the
S.B. Standing Sails latter part moderate breezes with
fine pleasant weather steering S.W. so ends

Lat by Obs. 22.14 Long by Chrt. 55.20

Sunday February 26th 1843
Commences with a light air from N.W. steering S.W. at
5 P.M. halled up S.W. middle and latter part moderate breezes
from N.W. North to N.W. with fine pleasant weather
so ends Lat by Obs. 23.34 Long by Chrt. 56.00

Monday February 27th 1843 Commences
with a brisk wind from N.E. with pleasant weather steering S.W.
at 6 P.M. bent another Top Gallant Standing Sails and set it
middle and latter part wind and weather much as the
first part steering the same so ends.

Lat by Obs. 25.35 Long by Chrt. 57.30

Ship Cambria from New Bedford towards the ^{Pacific Ocean}

Tuesday Feb. 25th 1843

All these 24 hours brisk winds from North N.E. to N.W.
with smoky weather steering S.W. and S.W. so ends.

Lat by Obs. 28.04 S Long by Chrt. 40.10 West

Wednesday March 1st 1843

All these 24 hours brisk winds from North with smoky
weather steering S.W. so ends. Lat by Obs. 30.17 Long 42.32

Thursday March 2nd 1843

Commences with a brisk wind from the S.W. with
thick weather at 6 P.M. halled in the S.B. Standing Sails
at 10 the wind halled to the Westward halled in the Topmast
standing Sails middle part the wind halled round to the
South at 2 P.M. tacked to the Westward thick and rainy
latter part brisk winds from the South with fair weather
so ends Lat by Obs. 31.15 Long by Chrt. 44.41 West.

Friday March 3rd 1843 Commences
with a brisk wind from the S.W. with fair weather
steering by the wind with the larboard tacks aboard middle
part moderate breezes from South to S.W. all Sails set
latter part vary moderate breezes from the S.E. 3 vessels
in sight so ends. Lat by Obs. 31.45 S Long by Chrt. 46.28 W

Saturday March 4th 1843

Commences with a moderate breeze from the Eastward
at 1 P.M. set the Topmast and S.B. Standing Sails middle
part moderate at 9 P.M. saw a shoal of Grampases
called them Whales dowered the boats for them
but soon found our mistake took up the boats kept
off S.W. and set the Standing Sails again moderate
breezes from N.E. with fine pleasant weather so ends

Lat by Obs. 32.55 S Long by Chrt. 46.29
