

Ship Cambria from New Bedford towards the S. Ocean

Saturday April 8th 1843

Commences with a brisk gale from the North West standing to the Westward with close reef Top Sail & reef Fore Sail at 4 P.M. set the Stubb at 9 P.M. the wind breezed on again took in the Stubb middle part brisk gales from N.W. which rained weather at 8 A.M. the wind veered N.W. wore Ship latter part brisk winds and fair weather set the Main Sail Stubb & Spanker so ends Lat by Obs. 50° 18' Long by Chrt. 80° 50'

Sunday April 9th 1843 Commences

with a moderate gale from N.W. inclined to blow on at 1 P.M. took in the Main Sail Stubb & Spanker half past 1 took in the Mizen Top Sail at 2 took in the Fore Top Sail half past 3 took in the Fore Sail heavy gale middle part more moderate wind from N.W. set close reefed Top Sails & reef Fore Sail latter part more moderate wind N.W. double reef Top Sails Courses Stubb and Spanker set dull prospects of getting to the North so ends

Lat by Obs. 49° 17' South

Monday April 10th 1843 Commences

with a brisk wind from the N.W. steering by the wind with the larboard tacks aboard half past 4 P.M. tacked to the Westward at 8 the wind veered to N.W. tacked Ship middle and latter part moderate breezes from West to N.W. with fine pleasant weather so ends.

Lat by Obs. 48° 44' Long by Chrt. 78° 28'

Tuesday April 11th 1843 Commences

with a moderate breeze from the Westward with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the larboard tacks aboard at 10 P.M. the wind halled to N.W. tacked to the South West. at 12 the wind counted to West in a squall put 2 reefs in the Top Sails at 2 A.M. wore Stubb at 4 turned the reef out set the M.I.G.S. at 9 A.M. the wind halled to N.W. tacked Ship half past 10 took a squall from West wore Ship to the N.W. so ends these 24 hours.

Ship Cambria of New Bedford in the South Pacific Ocean

Wednesday April 12th 1843 Commences

with a brisk wind from the Westward with pleasant weather steering by the wind to the N.W. at 3 P.M. the wind halled to N.W. half past 8 tacked to the S.W. at 4 A.M. the wind veered to West tacked at 7 A.M. tacked again to the Westward latter part light air and calms so ends. Lat by Obs. 46° 46' Long by Chrt. 78° 44'

Thursday April 13th 1843 Commences

with a moderate breeze from the North steering by the wind to the Westward middle part calm at 3 A.M. took a breeze from the South steered N.W. set the topmast Studding Sail at 5 set the I.G.S. latter part very moderate sun rain squalls so ends. Lat by Obs. 46° 54' Long by Chrt. 79° 36' West

Friday April 14th 1843 Commences

with a very light air from S.E. steering N.W. at 9 P.M. set a Main Top Gallant Studding Sail the other side put the Bow Boat out on the cranes middle part moderate Easterly Wind in strong Northerly at 2 A.M. halled in the Studding Sails and braced up sharp wind from N.E. so ends. Lat by Obs. 44° 47' Long by Chrt. 79° 50'

Saturday April 15th 1843

Commences with a brisk wind from N.E. with cloudy weather steering by the wind with the starboard tacks aboard at 6 the wind veered to East and breezed on took in the M.I.G.S. at 7 put 2 reefs in the Top Sails at 8 took in the Bow Boat middle part brisk winds with rain steering N.W. latter part wind E.S.E. pleasant all Sail set Topmast & I. Gallant & Sail so ends Lat by Obs. 41° 54' Long by Chrt. 80° 19'

Sunday April 16th 1843 Commences

with a brisk breeze from the S.E. with fine pleasant weather steering N.W. at 3 P.M. put the Bow Boat out on the cranes middle and latter part very moderate breezes from S.E. with fine pleasant weather so ends

Lat by Obs. 39° 52' South.

At 4 P.M. near the
3rd between the Sails
made the log 79.59
by Chron. 78.58
