

Ship Caribbea from Payta Working to the Westward.

Wednesday May 24th 1843 All these 24 hours moderate trades with smooth & weather steering N.W. and N.W. by E. so ends. Lat by Obs. 10° 55' S Long 83° 45' W.

Thursday May 25th 1843 All these 24 hours moderate trades from the South with fair weather first part steered N.W. middle part lay with the Main Top Sail to the Mast heading to the Westward latter part steering N.W. by E. employed fitting Davits for a fifth boat so ends Lat by Obs. 10° 58' S Long 85° 09' W.

Friday May 26th 1843 Commences with a very light air from the South with smooth weather steering by the wind with the larboard tacks aboard at night shortened Sail middle part wind and weather much as the first part at daylight made Sail latter part wind from S.E. and more of it with clear weather saw Porpoises, employed fitting for fifth boat so ends Lat by Obs. 10° 57' S Long by Obs. 86° 41' W.

Saturday May 27th 1843 Commences with a moderate trade with smooth weather at 2 P.M. put the fifth boat out on the cranes middle and latter part very light air steering S.W. all Sail set so ends. Lat by Obs. 10° 51' S Long by Obs. 88° 21' W.

Sunday May 28th 1843 Commences with a very light air from the South at 5 P.M. kept of West at 1 P.M. halled up the Courses at 1 P.M. halled the Main Top Sail to the mast half past 2 braced full again at daylight made all Sail halled up N.W. by E. half past 6 made Porter's Isle bearing N.E. by E. 15 miles distant at 2 made James's Isle, smooth weather saw Black fish Albatross in sight so ends Lat by Obs. 10° 9' South

Ship Caribbea from Abington Isle Working West

Monday May 29th 1843 Commences with a moderate trade from the S.E. steering S.W. at 1 P.M. saw Bird's Eye Isle bearing N.W. about 25 miles distant at 3 saw Abington Isle bearing N.W. by E. about the same distance at 6 P.M. luffed to the Main halled up the Courses middle part very moderate standing off and on at daylight kept off for Abington down tacks half past 6 P.M. saw Spinn Whales bearing N.E. about 6 miles off luffed for them half past 7 saw them again bearing East about 5 miles off half past 7 saw them again farther off but saw nothing more of them after that at 10 started from the Ship for the Shore with 2 Boats so ends.

Tuesday May 30th 1843 Commences with a moderate trade with a very strong N.W. current Ship standing off and on waiting for the Boats at 6 they returned with 9 very large Terapim and a lot of fish discharged the Boats took them up and steered N.W. through the night with a very light trade at daylight halled up by the wind latter part wind at South and pleasant so ends. Lat by Obs. 10° 35' S Long by Obs. 92° 45' W.

Wednesday May 31st 1843 Commences with a brisk breeze from the South with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the larboard tacks aboard middle and latter part wind from S.E. and more moderate so ends Lat by Obs. 10° 11' S Long by Obs. 90° 50' W.

Thursday June 1st 1843 All these 24 hours moderate trades with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the larboard tacks aboard all sail set so ends. Lat by Obs. 10° 54' S Long by Obs. 94° 50' W.

Friday June 2nd 1843 All these 24 hours moderate trades with pleasant weather steering by the wind to the S.W. latter part employed repairing the Main S.B. Sail and fitting the Yard so ends. Lat by Obs. 11° 58' S Long by Obs. 96° 10' W.
