

Ship Cambria at Anchor at Lahaina Aug 21st

Tuesday August 22nd 1843

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather on watch on liberty the other employed stowing water & boating & hour on shore so and sent a raft of cargo for water

Wednesday August 23rd 1843

Commences with fine pleasant weather took off to the ship a boat load of vegetables. middle pleasant latter the same took off a raft of water and stowed it away back on shore as usual

Thursday August 24th 1843

All these 24 hours pleasant first and latter part pleasant one watch on liberty the others employed boating of recruits the Carpenter got put in the fort so end

Friday August 25th 1843

All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather the watch employed taking off recruits one watch on liberty so ends

Saturday August 26th 1843

Commences with a moderate sea breeze 2 ships in sight in the offing at 7 the liberty men came on board middle part nearly calm the Annatta of New London with 2500 lbs anchored short of 12 months out the Elizabeth of New Bedford 27 months out so offern and so on what comes too about 5 AM. latter part light air and calm hove short hoisted the Fore Top Sail and got ready for sea so ends took the Carpenter out of the fort and brought him on board

Sunday August 27th 1843

Commences with a moderate sea breeze half past one made all sail took our anchor stood out with all on board that we took in besides a good recruit half past 3 took the grade run down between Perry and Monitor at 5 steered S.W. at 12 halled up a south fresh trade latter part very moderate so ends Lat by Obs. 19.03 Long by Obs. 157.58 West

Ship Cambria from Maui bound on a Cruise

Monday August 28th 1843

Commences with a brisk trade from the Eastward with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the larboard tacks aboard and all sail set middle and latter part much the same so ends Lat by Obs. 16.25 North Long by Obs. 157.58

Tuesday August 29th 1843

All these 24 hours brisk trade from E.N.E. steering S.E. with all sail set so ends Lat by Obs. 13.20 N Long by Obs. 157.51

Wednesday August 30th 1843

All these 24 hours brisk trade from E.N.E. with sun squalls steering S.E. with all necessary sail set so ends Lat by Obs. 10.33 Long by Obs. 157.03

Thursday Aug 31st 1843

Commences with a moderate trade from E.S.E. with fine pleasant weather steering by the wind with the larboard tacks aboard middle part much the same latter part wind from East to S.E. with rain so ends Lat by Obs. 8.39 North

Friday September 1st 1843

Commences with a moderate breeze with rain middle part squalls and calm with rain latter part calm with pleasant weather employed making a scuttlebutt so ends Lat by Obs. 8.13 Long by Obs. 157.51

Saturday Sept 2nd 1843

Commences with a moderate breeze from the N.E. steering S.E. by S middle part wind from E.N.E. to S.E. with showers of rain latter part much the same employed on the scuttle butt so ends Lat by Obs. 6.25 Long by Obs. 156.13
