

Ship Cambria While Cruising off the Curtis Islands.

Sunday January 20th 1844 Commences with brisk wind and fair weather steering by the wind to the South half past 6 more Ship at 7 shortened Sail middle part brisk wind at daylight set the Top Sails with reefs in them set the Main Sail & Luff at 10 let the reefs out of the Fore & Main Top Sails set the Main Sail so ends with a moderate breeze from ESE and pleasant winds Lat by Obs. 30.30 Long by Obs. 177.42

Monday January 29th 1844 Commences with a moderate breeze from the SE with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the starboard tacks aboard middle part daylight air from the S.W. at daylight made Sail latter part much as the middle part Carpenter employed repairing the rale that was broke in cutting the last Whale so ends

Lat by Obs. 30.28 Long by Obs. 177.28

Tuesday Jan^y 30th 1844 Commences with a calm and pleasant weather at midnight took a breeze from the Westward at daylight made Sail latter part of fine pleasant weather with a moderate breeze from the Westward steering SSE Carpenter employed building another house saw Porpoises & Tumpers so ends Lat by Obs. 30.56 Long by Obs. 177.3

Wednesday January 31st 1844 All these 24 hours moderate breezes from the Westward with pleasant weather saw Porpoises & Blackfish so ends

Lat by Obs. 30.27 Long by Obs. 178.55

Thursday February 1st 1844

Commences with a vary moderate breeze from the Westward steering S.W. at 2 P.M. saw 2 Ships ahead wore Ship and stood from them at 5 the wind left us at 7 shortened Sail at 10 P.M. took a breeze from N.W. stood to the NE at daylight made Sail at 6 kept off and steered S.W. with a vary light air so ends Lat by Obs. 30.18 South.

Friday Feb^y 2nd 1844 Commences with a vary light air from the N.W. steering South at 7 P.M. shortened Sail middle part calm at daylight took a breeze from SSE made Sail latter pleasant weather standing to the South West Carpenter employed on the horse so ends Lat by Obs. 30.19 Long by Obs. 177.21 West.

Saturday Feb^y 3rd 1844 Commences with a brisk wind from the S.E. with fair weather steering by the wind to the South at 7 P.M. shortened Sail middle part much as the first part at daylight set the Tuff & Spanker and Top Sails with 2 reefs in them at 8 set the Main Sail at 9 let one reef out of the Main Top Sail set the Main S.C. & Barke in sight so ends Lat by Obs. 31.23 Long by Obs. 178.29

Sunday February 4th 1844 Commences with a moderate breeze from the Eastward steering by the wind to the SSE at 7 P.M. shortened Sail middle part moderate at daylight made Sail at 8 lashed to the North at 10 the wind haled to the N.E. lashed to the E.S.E. one Sail in sight off our lee so ends Lat by Obs. 32.04 S Long by Obs. 178.10 West

Monday Feb^y 5th 1844 All these 24 hours moderate breezes from the NE with pleasant weather first and middle part standing to the Eastward latter part standing to the North so ends Lat by Obs. 32.27 Long by Obs. 178.22

Tuesday Feb^y 6th 1844 Commences with a moderate breeze with pleasant weather steering by the wind with the starboard tacks aboard 3 Ships in sight at 7 P.M. shortened Sail middle part much as the first part at daylight made Sail at 10 P.M. lashed to the S.E. latter part brisk winds from ENE and pleasant 2 Ships in sight so ends

Lat by Obs. 31.23 S Long by Obs. 177.35
