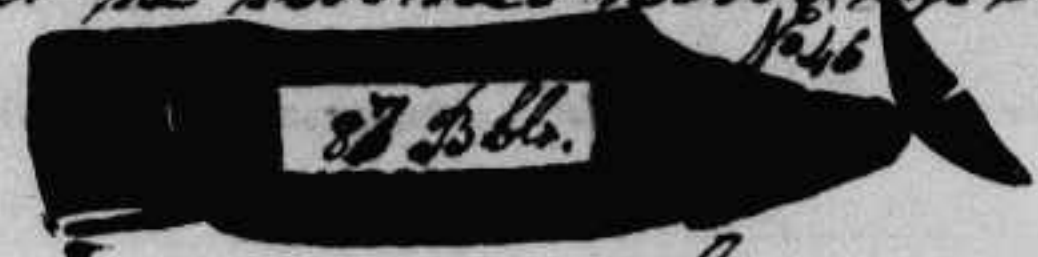


Ship Cambria While Cruising About the Equator

Thursday June 27th 1844 Commences
with brisk trades and pleasant weather steering N.W. at 6 P.M. shortened
Sail & luffed to the wind to the North middle part brisk trades at daylight
made Sail latter part steering S.W. repaired the Main & Mizen
Top & Sails so ends Lat by Obs. 10.2 N Long by Alt. 137.12

Friday June 28th 1844 Commences
with brisk trades and pleasant steering S.W. at 1 P.M.
shortened Sail & luffed to the wind to the N.E. middle part
very strong trades at daylight kept off West and made Sail
latter part very strong trades took in the M.S. Sail saw 2 backs
so ends Lat by Obs. 10.19 N Long by Alt. 138.30

Saturday June 29th 1844 Commences
with brisk trades and pleasant steering N.W. shifted to the fifth
and Main Top Sail at 6 P.M. shortened Sail & luffed to the wind
middle part moderate heading South at daylight kept off N.W.
and made Sail run down the rib off deck at half past 8 saw
a large Whale at 9 lowered the boats for him and struck the
third rising about 12 turned him up so ends No Observation



Sunday June 30th 1844
Commences with moderate trades and fair weather boats off fast
to the Whale half past 3 took him to the Ship at 4 commenced
cutting took the jaw and one piece out the head part the way off
at 6 took the hook out middle part moderate at 6 A.M. hooked onto
the Whale at 12 finished cutting so ends

Lat by Obs. 10.13 N Long by Alt. 139.51

Monday July 1st 1844 Commences
with moderate trades and pleasant weather at 1 commenced boiling
stood to the S.W. Cut up the Junk middle part steering by the
wind to the South latter part very strong trades standing to
the N.E. with a reef in the Top Sail's employed Boiling
so ends Lat by Obs. 10.23 N Long by Alt. 139.53

Ship Cambria While Cruising About the Equator

Tuesday July 3rd 1844 Commences
with moderate trades and pleasant steering by the wind to the N.E.
with one reef in the Top Sail's employed Boiling middle part must
the same at 5 A.M. finished Boiling and saw Ship let the reef
out of the Main Top Sail at 10 let the reef out of the Fore Top Sail
at the M.S. S.D. latter part moderate trades and pleasant employed
clearing up the Fore Hold so ends Lat by Obs. 10.15 N Long by Alt. 139.44

Wednesday July 3rd 1844 Commences
with moderate trades and pleasant steering by the wind to the South
at 1 P.M. shortened Sail middle part moderate pleasant weather
at daylight wore Ship to the S.E. and made Sail latter part
employed clearing up the After Hold and running rum Oil
down in a Tier forward so ends Lat by Obs. 10.18 N Long by Alt. 139.40

Thursday July 4th 1844 Commences
with moderate trades and pleasant weather steering by the wind
with the starboard tacks aboard at 6 P.M. shortened Sail middle
part wind and weather much with the first part at daylight
made Sail latter part brisk trades steering North employed
stowing Oil in the After Hold on the larboard side so ends
Lat by Obs. 10.14 N Long by Alt. 139.53

We have been Cruising between the
Long 115 and 118 West since the 21st of April
and have seen Whales but 6 times have caught 2 Whales
I shall now live on the Sandwich Islands and in hopes
to do better most crews.
