

Ship Cambria at anchor at Lahaina, H. Maui

Tuesday 16th July 1844 Commenced
with brisk trades and pleasant weather steering N.E. at 9 P.M. set the
fore topmast standing sail and kept off West. middle & latter part
brisk trades steering West so ends. Let by Oct. 21. 15. A Long by Oct. 15. 45

Wednesday July 17th 1844 Commenced
with brisk trades with squalls steering W by S middle part
much the same at midnight halted in the standing sail took
in the Main Royal. Fore & Mizzen S.E. at daylight set them
again half past 5 A.M. made the Lee. part of Maui bearing
S.W. & by compass halted up for it shifted over the standing
sail remainder part brisk trades and pleasant bent the chains
so ends.

Thursday July 18th 1844 Commenced
with light airs &c doing the best we could to get to an anchor.
at 4 P.M. came to in 20 fathoms water furled the sail got a raft
of bark ready to go on shore at 5 P.M. sent it in then let one
watch go ashore on liberty the other painted the ship's stern so ends

Friday July 19th 1844 All these 24
hours light airs and calm with pleasant weather. took a raft
of water off sent another raft of bark for water one watch
on shore in the day time so ends. blacked one side of
the ship's bands.

Saturday July 20th 1844 All these 24 hours
fine pleasant weather one watch on shore as usual stowed
away sun water and took the oth raft on board heated
the ship the other day and cleaned off the bands

Sunday July 21st 1844 All these
24 hours light baffling winds with fine pleasant weather
the watch on shore as usual so ends.

Monday July 22nd 1844 All these
24 hours with pleasant weather wind all round the compass took sun.
wood off cut it up and stowed it away one watch on shore as
usual so ends.

Tuesday July 23rd 1844 All these
24 hours pleasant weather with light baffling winds one watch on liberty in the
day time the other employed getting off wood and vegetables and storing
it away so ends.

Wednesday July 24th 1844 All these
24 hours fine pleasant weather employed getting off vegetables and
wood stowing water &c so ends, one watch on liberty as usual

Thursday July 25th 1844 All these
24 hours fine pleasant weather one watch on liberty in the
day time the other employed getting off vegetables &c so ends

Friday July 26th 1844 All these.
24 hours fine pleasant weather took off a raft of water stowed the
people's liberty in account of having one man to desert by the
name of James Dreib got the ship ready for sea
so ends.

Saturday July 27th 1844 Commenced
with moderate sea breezes middle part calm at daylight have
short & light breeze came off the land at 6 A.M. took our anchor
and stood off at 7 I left the ship to go in to ship a man in
the place of James Dreib. employed on board stowing the
anchors and chains clearing decks &c so ends
Had a bit of a row with the boys they refused to do duty because their liberty was
staked put the spokesman in stocks but then in the gun room they were to be staked
with out much trouble.

Sunday July 28th 1844 Commenced
with light baffling winds at 1 P.M. I returned to the ship
with a man that I gave the name of John Kerei
took up the boatstow off at 2 P.M. took the trades
shaped my courses down between Koko Kai & Lanai at 4
halted up S.W. at 5 halted up S.W. at midnight halted up S.W.
latter part moderate breeze all sail steered S.E. & so ends James Dreib
still in bonds. for putting him self at the head, as spokes man of a
mutiny. Should no wish on his part to make any amolagement
for his conduct I have allowed him 36 hours to make up his mind
has either got to make an amolagement to me or his time is up tomorrow
and then he is to be put in the rigging and shipped untill he is willing and oes it
